Two pre-meetings were held with Elders and partners January 9 and 22 to co-develop the meeting agenda and sharing circle discussion questions.

Presentations were given by Indigenous and non-Indigenous clinicians and leaders. In the afternoons of each day, sharing circles were held to discuss Emergency Department experiences.

The discussions held and relationships developed provide a foundation for the newly funded Canadian Institutes of Health Research (CIHR) project “Understanding and Defining Quality of Care in the Emergency Department with First Nations Members in Alberta.”

Learnings will inform the investigators in developing qualitative interview guides for the CIHR funded work.
